

Services For Children: An Agenda For Research

Children are dependent on a wide variety of people, institutions, and circumstances in their daily lives. Publicly financed services are only a part--usually only a small part--of the child's environment. To study children's problems and needs only in narrow, program-specific contexts is to miss a vital point: the effectiveness of these services depends on how they relate to the overall environment in which children live.

In our discussions of child care, youth services, and public financing of children's services, we have tried to show that focusing on children rather than on agencies and programs leads to more fundamental questions concerning children's needs and the ways in which statutory and publicly financed services can meet those needs. Child care may better be approached as a broad range of formal and informal
